

## François Péron

Born 22 August 1775 in Cérilly (Allier)

Assistant zoologist on board the *Géographe*

Took on principal responsibility for the zoological work of the expedition following the deaths of the other two zoologists, Levillain and Maugé

Conducted pioneering scientific work in the field of marine biology

Also responsible for recording many anthropological observations of indigenous peoples

Sought, and was accorded, responsibility for compiling the historical narrative of the expedition, the *Voyage de découvertes aux Terres australes*. Volume 1 was published in 1807; the second volume was completed by Louis Freycinet following the death of Péron in 1810 and published in 1816.

Age on departure from Le Havre: 25

Died in Cérilly on 14 December 1810, from tuberculosis
